Instructions for filling up the columns headed "Profession or Occupation."

1. STATUTORY OBLIGATION TO ACT AS ENUMERATOR. Section 4 of the Census (Great Britain) Act, 1910, provides that "the Governor, Master, Chief Resident Officer, Manager, or other person in charge of every prison, workhouse, hospital, lunatic asylum, or public or charitable institution or other large establishment, which may be determined upon by the Registrar General, shall be the enumerator of the inmates thereof, and shall conform to such instructions as may be sent to him by the authority of the Local Government Board for obtaining the returns required by this Act, so far as may be practicable, with respect to the inmates."

It having been determined by me that the Institution or Establishment named on the cover of this book is one to which this provision of the Act shall apply, you are required to enumerate the inmates therein by entering or causing to be entered the necessary particulars in this book.

2. PERSONS WHO MUST BE INCLUDED IN THE RETURN:—

The return must include:—

- (a) Every person who passed the night of Sunday, April 2nd, in this Institution or Establishment or in the grounds thereof, and was alive at midnight.
- (b) Every person who, although not in the Institution or Establishment during the Census night, arrived on the morning of Monday, April 3rd, and had not been enumerated elsewhere.

The return must not include:—

- (a) Any person who had died before midnight on Sunday, April 2nd.
- (b) Any child born after midnight on Sunday, April 2nd.
- (c) Any resident who was absent on the night of Sunday, April 2nd, and did not return in the morning.
- (d) Any person who had been enumerated elsewhere.

3. SUMMARISING THE RETURN. When you have entered the required particulars concerning all the persons in the Institution or Establishment, you must:—

- (a) Make certain that the ages of all the males are entered in column 3, and of all the females in column 4 of the Return. **Great attention must be paid to this point in order that accurate totals of males and females respectively may be obtained.**
- (b) Count the numbers of males, females, and of persons, and enter the totals in the spaces provided at the foot of each page.
- (c) Carry the totals from the foot of each page into the Abstract on page iv and complete the Summary on that page.
- (d) Enter in the space provided on page iv, the required particulars of buildings constituting the Institution or Establishment, the number of rooms, and population in each building.

4. DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS TO REGISTRAR. Having complied with the above instructions, you must, as soon as possible, but in no case later than Saturday, April 8th, deliver this book to the Registrar from whom you received it, together with your claim for payment. A form of claim will be supplied to you by the Registrar.

5. STATUTORY DECLARATION. In pursuance of Section 11 of the above-mentioned Census Act you are required to make a Statutory Declaration to the effect that the Return furnished by you is correct. The form of Declaration is given on the following page and must be made before the Registrar or Superintendent Registrar at the time of delivering this book.

6. SCALE OF FEES for the Enumerator of an Institution or other large Establishment. For the due and satisfactory performance of all the duties imposed upon you under the Census Act, you will in due course be paid the sum authorised by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, according to the following scale:—

- (a) A fixed Fee of 7s. 6d.
- (b) An additional Fee of 2s. 6d. for every 100 persons enumerated over and above the first 500 (proportional parts of 100 being paid for at the same rate).

NOTE.—Every effort will be made to secure the payment of Enumerators at the earliest possible date, but as their claims for fees must be duly certified by the Registrar and Superintendent Registrar it is improbable that Enumerators can be paid before the end of May.

COLUMN 10.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PERSONAL OCCUPATION.—Describe the Occupation fully in Column 10. If more than one Occupation is followed, state that by which living is mainly earned.

2. DEALERS, SHOPKEEPERS OR SHOP ASSISTANTS as distinct from MAKERS, PRODUCERS OR REPAIRERS. All such persons should be so described as to leave no doubt whether they are Dealers or Makers. In many cases "Tailors," "Bootmakers," "Hatters," "Watchmakers," "Goldsmiths," "Silversmiths," "Jewellers," "Chemists," "Bakers," "Sealmen," "Printers," &c., and their Assistants are not Makers or Producers; in such cases the word "Dealer," "Shopkeeper," or "Shop Assistant" should be added to the occupational name. A person who both makes and deals should be described as "Maker," if chiefly Maker, or "Dealer," if chiefly Dealer.

3. OUT OF WORK.—If out of work or dismissed at the time of the Census, the usual occupation must be stated.

4. THE OCCUPATIONS OF WOMEN engaged in any business or profession, including women regularly engaged in assisting relatives in trade or business, must be fully stated. No entry should be made in the case of wives, daughters, or other female relatives wholly engaged in domestic duties at home.

5. CHILDREN AT SCHOOL AND STUDENTS.—For all persons over ten years of age attending school write "School," and for those attending colleges, evening schools, or other instructional classes, or receiving instruction privately, write "Student," and for those studying the profession, as "Law Student," "Medical Student."

If attending school or other classes half time or part time only, write "School part time," or "Student part time." If also engaged in any employment state the employment, as "School, Newspaper"; "School, Green's Errand Boy"; "School part time, Cotton Roving Frame Driver."

6. RETIRED OR PENSIONED.—If retired or pensioned state the fact, and add former Occupation, as "Retired Farmer," "Retired Butcher," "Police Constable," &c. The present occupation, if any, of pensioners should also be stated in all cases, as "Army Pensioner, Bank Porter," &c.

7. PRIVATE MEANS.—For persons neither following nor having followed a profession or occupation, but deriving their income from private sources, or allowances, write "Private Means."

8. VAGUE OR INDEFINITE TERMS MUST NOT BE USED ALONE, such for example as Apprentice, Assistant, Caretaker, Collector, Conductor, Foreman, Inspector, Labourer, Machinist, Manager, Manufacturer, Mechanic, Millman, Overlooker, Superintendent (see also paragraphs 10 & 11 below). Care should be taken that no occupational name common to different industries is used without a full and distinctive description; an Enameller should be described as a "Pottery Enameller," "Watch-dial Enameller," "Cycle Enameller," &c.; a Painter as a "Palmer Artist," "Ship Painter," "House Painter," &c.; a Brewer as a "Brewer" or "Brewery Brewer," "Ship Plats Riveter," "Boat Riveter," &c.

(a) **ARMY, NAVY, CIVIL SERVICE, MUNICIPAL SERVICE, &c.** State the service and rank or grade.
(b) **CLERGYMAN, PRIEST, MINISTER.** State whether "Clergyman (Established Church)," "Bishop, Catholic Priest," "Western Methodist Minister," &c. Clergymen who are also Schoolmasters should be returned as Schoolmasters. In the case of Local or Denominational Preachers, the ordinary occupation only should be given.

(c) **LEGAL PROFESSION.** State whether "Barrister," "Solicitor," "Solicitor's Articled Clerk," "Law Clerk," &c.
(d) **AGENT, BROKER, BUYER, MERCHANT, SALESMAN, COMMERCIAL TRAVELLER.** State particular kind of business or trade, as "Cycle Agent," "Sugar Broker," "Coal Merchant," "Commercial Traveller, Millinery," &c.

(e) **CLERK.** State whether "Bank Clerk," "Insurance Clerk," "Law Clerk," "Solicitor's Clerk," "Road Clerk," "Railway Clerk," "Theatre Clerk," &c.
(f) **ENGINEERING AND METAL TRADES.** State precise branch of trade and nature of operation, as "Engineer's Pattern Maker," "Ship Fitter's Helper," "Iron Worker," in no instance state whether employed as Ship Fitter, Publishing Furnace, Iron Foundry, &c.

(g) **ENGINEER, ENGINE-DRIVER, STOKER, FIREMAN.** State whether "Railway Engine Stoker," "Traction Engine Driver," "Stationary Engine," "Gas Stoker," "Furnace Stoker at Pottery," &c.
(h) **COTTON, WOOL, SILK OR OTHER TEXTILE OPERATIVE, DYER, BLEACHER, &c.** State the material and the precise occupation, as "Woolen Comber in Cotton Spinning Room," "Silk Thrower's Piece," "Planer in Cotton Filling Works," &c.

(i) **MINER, QUARRYMAN.** State kind of mine or quarry, and nature of work, as "Coal Miner, Down," "Colliery Headframe (below ground)," "Colliery Lamp Examination (above ground)," "Colliery Labourer (above ground)," "Copper or Ironstone Mine," "Delver in Stone Quarry," "Bathman in Stone Quarry," &c.
(j) **FARMER.** State whether "Farmer," "Grazier," or "Farm Bailiff." Farmers' sons or other relatives assisting in the work of the farm should be returned as "Farmer's Son working on Farm," "Farmer's Healer working on Farm," "Farmer's Daughter, Dairy work," &c.

(k) **FARM SERVANT.** State nature of work, and indicate if mainly in charge of horses, cattle, &c., as "Horseman on Farm," "Waggoner on Farm," "Drover on Farm," "Shepherd." A labourer on a Farm whose work is of a general character should be described as "Farm Labourer," not simply as a Labourer.
(l) **LABOURER, PORTER, &c.** State nature of employment, as "Bridgeway Labourer," "Dock Labourer," "Railway Contractor's Labourer," "Farm Labourer," "General Labourer," "Coal Porter," "Railway Porter," &c. The terms "Labourer," "Porter," should never be used alone.

(m) **DOMESTIC SERVICE.** State nature of service, as "Cook (Domestic)," "Housemaid (Domestic)," "Gardener (Domestic)," "Gardener (Domestic)," "Barney Groomer," &c.
(n) **SERVANTS, WAITERS, &c., IN HOTELS, CLUBS, RESTAURANTS AND BOARDING HOUSES.** State nature of employment and service in which engaged, as "Hotel Cook," "Hall Porter at Club," "Hotel Waiter," "Restaurant Waitress," &c.
(o) **NURSE.** State whether "Nurse (Domestic)," "Maternity Nurse," "Sick Nurse," &c.

(p) **GARDENER.** State whether "Gardener (Domestic)," "Market Gardener," "Jobbing Gardener," "Nurseryman," &c.
(q) **COACHMAN, GROOM, MOTOR-CAR DRIVER.** State whether employed in Club, Omnibus, Licensed or other service, as "Coachman (Domestic)," "Coachman (Domestic)," "Motor-Car Driver," "Motor-Bus Driver," "Tramway Motor Man," &c.

COLUMN 11.

8. INDUSTRY OR SERVICE WITH WHICH CONNECTED.—The information asked for in this column is required in order to ascertain for each industry or service how many persons are employed therein, or in connection therewith, although following a distinct occupation. Thus, for instance, for breweries it is desired to know how many coopers, blacksmiths, bricklayers, &c., are in the direct employment of the brewery, as well as the numbers actually engaged in brewing processes. Further, it is desired to ascertain the number of persons directly employed by central or local government authorities, whether in administration or in undertakings such as tramways, gasworks, &c. Following are examples of cases in which entries should be made in Column 11 as well as in Column 10.

Extract from the Census (Great Britain) Act, 1910.

SECTION 11. Every enumerator shall make a statutory declaration to the effect that the returns furnished by him in pursuance of this Act or the instructions issued thereunder have been truly and faithfully taken, and that to the best of his knowledge they are correct so far as may be known, and such declaration may be made before a superintendent registrar or registrar, who for that purpose shall have power to take such statutory declaration as if he were an officer by law authorised to administer an oath.

SECTION 12.—(1) If any superintendent registrar, registrar, enumerator, or other person employed under this Act, makes wilful default in the performance of any of his duties under this Act, or makes any wilfully false declaration, he shall for each offence be liable on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

(2) If any occupier for whom a schedule is left under this Act—

- (a) wilfully refuses, or without lawful excuse neglects, to fill up or cause to be filled up the schedule to the best of his knowledge and belief, or to sign and deliver it as by this Act required; or
- (b) wilfully makes, signs, or delivers, or causes to be made, signed, or delivered, any false return of any matter specified in the schedule; or
- (c) refuses to answer, or wilfully gives a false answer to, any question necessary for obtaining the information required to be obtained under this Act;

he shall for each offence be liable on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

(3) If any person employed in taking the census communicates, without lawful authority, any information acquired in the course of his employment, he shall be guilty of a breach of official trust within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1889, and that Act shall apply accordingly.
