2020/2021: Excluding the precept the Parish Council received £15,357 more than in the preceding financial year which included:

- CIL (£13,900); and
- Funding for the Neighbourhood Plan (£1,400).

Sub Section 6:

In the current financial year, the Parish Council paid out £4,478 less than in the preceding financial year. This was, in part, due to Covid 19 and fact the Parish Council did not meet from April until September and in the preceding financial year spent:

- £1,898 on works to a triangle of land on which the Village Sign is erected;
- £558 on a replacement defibrillator cabinet;
- £600 more on donations than in this financial year; and
- £1,388 on the neighbourhood plan.
